

*The Second Lesson

A Reading from the Gospel according to Luke

LK. 4:21-30

Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, "Is this not Joseph's son?" He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' And you will say, 'Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum.'"

And he said, "Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in his hometown. A Music Note

As we enter into Black History Month, the music selections will remember and celebrate the rich contributions of African-American persons to the body of the church's song. The congregational hymns are largely drawn from the spiritual tradition, as is the anthem; the introit is a setting of the beloved 23^{rd} Psalm by composer Leon C. Roberts; the anthem is a contemporary arrangement of a lesser known spiritual; and the communion setting is by Mark A. Miller, a living composer and life-long United Methodist who currently serves on the faculties of Drew Theological School and Yale University. The prelude and postlude this morning are both by Florence B. Price, a composer, organist, pianist, and teacher, who was the first African-American woman to have her works performed by a major American symphony.
